Dear Parents/Carers,

Pupil Premium/Free School Meals etc.

Please could parents check if you think your child may be eligible for Pupil Premium.

Why should I apply?

For every child that is entitled to free school meals the school receives extra funding to enhance provision and improve progress and outcomes for children. So please apply even if you do not wish to take up your free school meal. You can also receive financial support with trips, holiday meal vouchers/schemes, some after school clubs, free school milk and access to our Breakfast Club.

What are the qualifying criteria for Free School Meals?

Your child might be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get).

Class Snippets

Pre-school – The children have used their mark making skills to add faces to pumpkins, spot pictures around the garden and use a tick list. They have enjoyed making lots of firework pictures using toilet roll tubes, bingo dabbers and rolling marbles or chestnuts in paint. We have also talked about staying safe on Bonfire Night.

Class 1 - This week, C1 have been focussing on how to keep our teeth healthy. We have been conducting experiments involving Coca Cola, Orange Juice and eggs, and we have been making predictions about what will happen to eggs overnight! Our final experiment involved covering an egg in toothpaste before submerging it in Orange Juice. We are waiting to see the results and a lot of children have already predicted that the toothpaste might protect the egg from the Orange Juice. We have had lots of fun, whilst broadening our vocabulary and knowledge of dental hygiene!

Class 2 - This week, Class 2 have been very busy! We started gymnastics this week - the children listened very well and all tried their best with the new exercises we were taught. I'm sure they all had achy arms when they got home. We have also been writing instructions this week in preparation for making a sandwich and baking some bread rolls.

Class 3 - This week, Class 3 experienced a virtual trip to the British museum in London. The children took part in a live zoom and explored some of the artefacts from the museum and the completed a quiz. The children really enjoyed this experience and showed the host of the zoom how amazing their Stone Age knowledge is! Well done, Class 3!

What is HAF?

The Holiday Activity and Food Programme (HAF) is a Department for Education funded initiative to provide free activities and food for children in reception to year 11 who are eligible for pupil premium free school meals.

When is HAF happening? HAF will be running for 4 days between 19-22 December.

When will bookings go live? HAF bookings will go live from 1 December

What do I need to do in the meantime?

To make sure you're ready to book your activities this December, you need to need to do the following things:

1. Make sure you're registered on our Children's Activity Booking Site (CABS). This is important as this is the booking system you will use to book your HAF activities.
