Year 2 Wonder Women

Essential Knowledge

By the end of this unit children will know...

- Women in the past have had an impact on the world we live in today.
- That in the past people were not always treated fairly and some women protested until things changed.
- How to research people's lives using books, the Internet, artefacts and pictures.
- How to present their work in a variety of different ways.

Launch

Children will talk about famous people which they are familiar with. Draw portraits of famous people.

Introduce the names of famous women to be studied.

Do you know any of them already?

Explore

Children will learn more about the lives of famous women from the past.

Children will perform songs, a dance and share learning with other classes.

Energise

Queen Victoria visits the Victorians.

Or

Look at pictures from a Victorian museum.

Celebrate

Invite parents and carers into school for a celebration event.

Children are to act as guides to their 'Great Exhibition' and presentation.

Wonder Women Year 2: Theme Content

Personal Development

Spiritual

- Ask questions about puzzling aspects of life.
- Explain how actions affect others.

Moral

- Try new things with the help of others.
- Talk about some things of personal interest.
- Join in with familiar activities.

Social

- Show an understanding that one's own behaviour affects other people.

Cultural

- Identify some of the different ways the past has been represented. .
- Be introduced to concepts such as women's' rights and the social rights movement.

Foundation Subjects

History, Geography and Citizenship

History

- Describe historical events, such as Emily Davidson at the Derby in 1913.
- Describe significant people from the past such as Queen Elizabeth 1 and Queen Victoria.
- Recognise that there are reasons why people in the past acted as they did.— children will discuss fairness
- Observe or handle evidence to ask questions and find answers to questions about the past. When artefacts arrive in their castle.

Geography

- Use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries, as well as the countries, continents and oceans studied. Children will identify the areas where Queen Victoria ruled

Art and Design and Design Technology

- Use some of the ideas of artists studied to create pieces. Based on Beatrix Potter's illustrations
- Draw lines of different sizes and thickness.
- Colour (own work) neatly following the lines.

Music, Languages and Physical Education

- Take part in singing, accurately following the melody in Elizabethan music.
- Use symbols to represent a composition and use them to help with a performance

Use a range of applications and devices in order to communicate ideas, work and messages throughout the topic.

Wonder Women Year 2: Links to National Curriculum Framework

Core Subjects:

English

- To read and understand the layout of non-fiction books.

 - Use some of the characteristic features of the type of writing used.
 - Write, review and improve.
- To present work using speaking and listening skills.

Mathematics

Wonder Women Year 2: Assessment Opportunities/Tasks within theme

Core Subjects

English

- Children read for information and will produce writing in a variety of genres.
- Diaries
- Instructions
- Information / explanation

Mathematics

- Children will show that they can order dates to create simple timelines.
- They will read and produce tables and simple graphs to present their work.

Science

- Children will use hand lenses and microscopes to look at natural and man-made items.
- Children will name plants and animals.

Foundation Subjects

History, Geography and Citizenship

Children will...

- Create big information books showing understanding of Elizabethan times.
- They will create presentations about Queen Victoria.
- They will show they recognise continents by colouring in the areas covered by the British Empire during Victorians reign.
- They will create fact sheets about Florence Nightingale.
- Present their work to other classes and parents.

Art and Design and Design Technology

- Children will create their own art work / animal pictures, based on the work of a Victorian illustrator.

Music, Languages and Physical Education

- Children will learn and perform an Elizabethan dance.
- Children will learn and perform an Elizabethan song.

Computing

Children will use computers to research and present their work using a variety of software.
