#### Play in a Day workshop

We were treated to a wonderful performance by Class 3 children this week as they learnt lines and actions to present a play about Black History Month. They told us about the White Lion slavery ship and how William Wilberforce helped to stop slavery in this country. Then we were transported to Maryland, USA where we learnt about Harriet Tubman and her escape from slavery. With the help of the underground rail road she was able to find freedom from slavery but later she went back and helped others to escape too. Next there was a scene from Alabama where Rosa Parks refused to give up her seat for a white man on a bus before finally hearing about Dr Martin Luther King Jr, who shared his dream that one day everyone would be treated equally.

The children were absolutely brilliant and played lots of different parts so well. We were all impressed with how clearly they spoke and how many of their lines they remembered. Hopefully they have shared what they have learnt at home; please do ask them about it.

FoSM have set the date for the next school disco for Thursday 9th November.


KS1 Disco 5:30 pm - 6:15 pm (Pre-school, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2)

## Class Snippets - (Article 28- children have the right to an education. Article 29- Education should develop a child's talents, personalities and beliefs)

**Pre-school** have been taken over my pumpkins this week! We have been developing our fine motor skills by using a hammer to tap golf tees into pumpkins, drawing faces on pumpkin sheets and using orange collage pieces and materials to create our own pumpkin pictures. We also did a Halloween picture hunt in the Pre-School garden. We have been engrossed all week in Halloween themed number songs too!

**Class 1 –** Reception - this week we have been working hard on our segmenting and blending skills during our phonics lessons and when reading with an adult. The new sounds we have learnt this week are (o, c, k, ck) and our HFW's (to, into, go, no, the). For Maths we have been practising our subitising skills and working with the number 4.

As a class we have been looking closely at 'where do we live?'. We have been looking at our homes individually and where our homes are nationally and globally. The children have drawn wonderful pictures of their homes and of planet earth.

**Class 2** - in Class 2 this week, we have begun to plan and write our fictional story based on Billy and the Beast. The children painted their beast, drew their front cover and created a story board of what would happen in their story. The class have enjoyed thinking carefully about what their beast will try to make the animals into - a hedgehog soup, a fox sandwich and even a badger stew! In History this week, we have begun to look at the life of Amelia Earhart. We explored what her thoughts would have been as she flew across the Atlantic Ocean.

**Class 3** - produced an amazing show this week that they performed to parents/carers and Class 4 pupils. They learnt about Black History month and some important figures that shape changes in our world. They created a boat scene to show the work of William Wilberforce, a bus to show Rosa Parks' story and Harriet Tubman's underground rail road to help black people escape from slavery. They impressed us with how they managed to put the whole show together in a day with the help from Mark at Konflux Theatre. We have been discussing rights in class linked to non-discrimination and speaking out (Article 2, 12 and 13). They have written brilliant letters in the role of a character too using some compound sentences.

**Class 4** have worked hard on writing their memoirs and editing them this week. This has meant the children have had to use lots of their knowledge and skills to improve their work, which is not always an easy process, however, lots of them have shown resilience and determination with this. The children enjoyed watching Class 3's Play in a Day, themed around Black History; well-done Class 3 – the children were impressed with what you managed to achieve in a day. Their flute lessons are going well and Miss Wilson is pleased with their progress; the children are reading more notes and performing more whole pieces together... it is also lovely to see other children wishing to take up the small group flute lessons as well. Please note, the children have had to be spoken to this week about kindness to each other online and there has been a steady increase in these types of incidences being reported to school; please can we ask that parents remain vigilant with what their children are doing online (phones/tablets/gaming) and regularly check their chats. We talked about how much trust is instilled in them with having these devices and they need to ensure that they are making responsible choices.

## Childrensfund – Half-term Free School Meals

We would like to make you aware of the holiday Free School Meal (FSM) voucher scheme that Gloucestershire County Council is currently offering to families in Gloucestershire.

Applications for holiday FSM vouchers for October half term are open from midday 03 October until **midday 17 October**. Voucher emails will be sent out on 23 October. Please check junk/spam folders during this period as sometimes the vouchers end up there.

Skills for Learning, Learning for Life

If parents have not received their vouchers by 25 October, email childrensfund@gloucestershire.gov.uk.

Families who have signed up to the scheme or who are already registered will receive a total of £15 per child. To find out more about the scheme and to apply, parents can visit our <u>Holiday FSM</u> <u>vouchers webpage</u>.

Parents who have signed up previously do not need to re-register, they will already have been included. To ensure we reach all those who are eligible, we are encouraging parents that have not previously signed up, to sign up as soon as they can. If you feel you may be eligible for Free School Meals and have not applied, you can apply here - <u>apply for free school meals</u>

Using vouchers – vouchers will only be awarded once the parent has registered for the scheme and cannot be backdated. Vouchers are valid for 6 months, although should be used in the holiday period in which they are awarded. If vouchers are not claimed and have expired, they cannot be re-issued. Vouchers not received should be queried via email to

<u>childrensfund@gloucestershire.gov.uk</u> by the end of the holiday period. For any parents wishing to update details of an existing application, please email <u>childrensfund@gloucestershire.gov.uk</u> so we can update their account, as details are not automatically updated.
