Attendance

Attendance at school is so important and non-attendance can effect well-being and academic progress at school. Our whole school attendance is currently at 94%, with 21 children currently below 90% and only 3 children with 100% attendance. The school understands that illnesses happen

but if there is any doubt about sending your child in, we do monitor children very closely and we can send home if required. You can find details of your child's attendance on their short report.

Pre-school – This week we have read the Easter story - the children were amazed that this was 'baby Jesus' from what they had previously learnt at Christmas! We have talked about our Easter knowledge and experiences, created Easter eggs using a variety of media and tools including potato and pom printing, watercolours and charcoal. The children have decorated Easter cakes and today we have enjoyed an Egg hunt!





Class 1 have had a very busy last week of term. We had our last gymnastics session, which the children engaged very well with and have demonstrated huge progress since the start of Spring 2. On Wednesday, the children attended a didgeridoo workshop, where Paul taught us

about the origins of the didgeridoo and we all got a chance at playing one together. This week we have learnt two new Tricky Witch sounds 'ear' and 'ure' alongside the HFW's 'day, play, away, children'. We have also been enjoying the warmer and dryer weather this week in the outside area, engaging in water and sand play.

Skills for Learning, Learning for Life

Class 2 have had a strange week this week! Ms Bradbury has been working with them to make some beautiful Easter cards, the children really enjoyed making these and they were very proud of their creations. On Wednesday we had a very exciting visitor! A man called Paul came in to teach us how to play the didgeridoo! The children had lots of fun doing this and there were some didgeridoo experts in the making. Paul also taught us that rainmakers were originally made from









cactus skin; we compared his authentic one to the ones we made. Thank you to the Friends of Steam Mills who funding this amazing experience for the children in Class 1 and 2. This has finished our Australia topic this term; the children have some amazing knowledge now of the differences between here and there. They have made so much progress this term and they really should all be proud of themselves.

Class 3 - This week, class 3 have had an explosive time in DT. They tested their volcano models using

bicarbonate of soda, vinegar, washing liquid and food colouring. They were amazing and the children found that if you use more food colouring you get a darker lava flow! In writing, they have been writing non-chronological reports to showcase their learning about volcanoes! They were amazing and the children have clearly engaged well with this topic.

I am sure they will be excited to learn about the romans after Easter.



I am really proud of how class 3 have been working as a team this half term. I hope they all have a wonderful Easter break and look forward to taking them to Caerleon on our trip the first week back!









Class 4 have had a busy week with finishing their units of work: in writing, they have produced some great next chapters for The Viewer... Tristan met a range of fates from being stuck in the Viewer forever, to thinking the whole experience had been a dream - or had it?! In the hall, there is an exhibition of their Monet art work: this has received lots of compliments from parents, children and staff - the techniques they've used have been very effective and they



had an opportunity to reflect on their own, and each other's, work. They have also finished their DT and Geography this week and are ready for the next term. Next term, Class Teachers will be Mrs Thomas (Mon, Tues and Weds AM), Miss Barber (Weds PM) and Miss Carlson (Thurs and Fri).

The 3 R's – Regulate, Relate, Reason

Ms Barber (SENCo) has attached a flyer by Dr Bruce Perry which she found recently. It may be useful for anyone who suffers stress or anxiety.

"To help a child to the point where they can reflect and think abstractly, we need to start from the bottom up. Dr Perry recommends the "3 Rs" of Regulate, Relate and Reason as a physiologically appropriate sequence of engagement."

It suggests 3 steps to help overcome episodes and to help with ongoing management. We thought it may be useful.
