We have also been talking again about the Easter story and on Thursday the children took part in the Easter parade around the school. Class 1 – Full on week this week. All of the children have been writing wonderful instructions on how to plant a seed using time connectives and we finished writing the results of our science experiment. Reception have been doing some more work on doubles to 10 and have started to look at odd and even numbers (odd block and even tops NumberBlocks episode is useful to practise this concept). The children have all made Easter cards in school, but they have not been written in, this is an activity for them to do at home to practise their writing. All phase 2 and 3 phonics sound have been taught, please practise these at home with your children.

Class 2 – this week, Class 2 finished their recounts of our trip to Slimbridge. They worked very hard to remember what we had done on our trip and tried hard to use adjectives and time connectives. We have also completed our DT unit; wonderful windmills. The children have been experimenting with how to make a strong based, sails that fly in the wind and then designing their own windmill. They have worked very hard this term and to celebrate that we ended our week with an Easter egg hunt.

Class 3 have had a busy week writing non-chronological reports about Anglo-Saxons and Vikings. They thought carefully about their learning from the topic and used some brilliant vocabulary. In art, they have been colour mixing to create extensions of paintings by JMW Turner. They have also had a fun time making Easter cards.

Class 4 have had a very busy week! The children have written their persuasive letters to the Prime Minister about the Orangutans' plight linked to deforestation and climate change - they did really well with this and lots have produced a piece of writing to be proud of. In DT, the children have finished their bird hides; the structures were very creative and we're sure the wildlife would enjoy living in them. In Art, the children have been painting their final pieces. They have had to show lots of resilience and patience this week to produce these pieces and they have done this successfully! They've certainly earned a good rest - have a lovely Easter Break Class 4!
