Class Snippets - (Article 28- children have the right to an education. Article 29- Education should develop a child's talents, personalities and beliefs)

**Pre-school** – this week Pre-School have been looking at our facial features and the differences that make us all special. We have used a mirror to see and talk about our reflection and used paint to create a self-portrait. We have discussed the change in weather and began to look at the season 'Autumn'.

**Class 1** have behaved very well for their supply teacher this week, she was particularly impressed with the children's tidying up skills! Today with Mrs Evans, we read "Elmer" by David McKee. The children also enjoyed decorating their own elephant to show that we are all special and we all belong. In Phonics this week we have investigated and learnt "sat".

**Class 2** - this week in Class 2 we have been researching and writing fact files. The children finished their fact files about Astronauts this morning, which lead us nicely into our history lesson about Neil Armstrong and his life. Some children thought about whether they would like to go to space and were happy to learn you can still eat pizza in space! The children have enjoyed our class book Astro Girl and have all done some lovely writing around this. We will be looking at a new book next week.

**Class 3** have enjoyed music this week and we have been rehearsing a song playing the notes C and D on the glockenspiels. The children have impressed me with their knowledge of musical notation including using the vocabulary: stave, crotchet and minum. They have been busy writing a missing part of a story this week focusing on using adverbs and prepositions to make their writing interesting and in guided reading we have created flow maps to sequence events, tree maps to categorise characters and answered a range of comprehension questions.

**Class 4** have been working hard this week in a number of areas. Mrs Thomas was really impressed with some of their imaginative moves for their dances in PE, for the Haka – the children seem to be really enjoying the dance theme and how it currently links to the Rugby World Cup. Some children

are even watching the games so they can get some more ideas to bring to school, which is brilliant. Flute is also going well and they are impressing Miss Wilson with their improved embouchures and reading of music. Class 4 won class stars this week, which they were very pleased about!

#### **Severn Trent Water**

This week, KS2 children had an assembly with Severn Trent water learning all about sewers. Members of Class 3 helped pull items from the giant sewer that often get put down the drain or toilet and thought about how to stop fat bergs building up. They learnt a catchy song about the three Ps: paper, pee and poo! We were given this lovely certificate following our "Super Sewers" assembly.
