We also had a visit from Harold the Giraffe, as we completed a workshop on resilience and what it means/looks like to be resilient. Reception sounds this week are (h, b) and our HFW's are (oh, put, mum, big, up, him, had).

Class 2 – this week, Class 2 have been working really hard! They finished off their wonderful stories based on our class book, Billy and the Beast. All of the children worked so hard to make their stories the best they could be. We had a fun afternoon on Wednesday when we were trying to see how high we could get a rocket to fly. The children experimented with different techniques when setting it off to see which would have a better impact. The children really enjoyed seeing Harold the Giraffe again. I heard some beautiful responses about what they should do when their friends are upset, they really helped Harold solve some of his problems.

Class 3 had an exciting day yesterday playing music and creating artwork. They have created relief prints in the style of Andy Warhol using printing ink and repeating patterns. In writing, we have been working on leaflets about bandits and discussed a range of non-fiction features. The children have all worked very hard this term and are well deserving of a half term break!

Class 4 had a brilliant trip to the Birmingham Think Tank; the day flew by and some of the children didn't even want to come home! The children loved the interactive exhibits there and were wowed in the Planetarium... We will let the pictures do the talking ©.
