NEU member strike action

The NEU have declared the Weds 5th and Fri 7th July to be strike days for their members. As advance notice, our school will be affected but it is yet unknown as to whether there will be partial or full closures. We will keep you updated as soon as this is clear.

We appreciate that class/school closures are disruptive and are aware that all four teacher and leader unions are balloting members regarding co-ordinated strikes in the autumn term. This is based on under-funding for schools, inspection, workload, staff retention and below-inflation rate pay matters. Whilst staff do not want to strike or lose pay, they are willing to support potential longer term benefits for education and we ask for your continued understanding at this difficult time.

Tickets will be on sale from the school office and will be $\pounds 1$ each (please bring exact money). Tuckshop will be available, please no more than $\pounds 2$ per child to bring on the day.

Please can we ask, if at all possible, if you have siblings in the two different age groups that arrangements are made for them to be brought to their discos separately? We have very limited space in the school hall.

Parking/Collection of children

Please could we remind parents/carers not to park so that cars are obstructing the school gates or the junction with the main road. Also, as the junction at the KS2 end of the school is very busy with parents arriving/leaving, we would encourage parents to come into the playground to collect children, rather than ask for them to be sent out to you to navigate the parked cars and traffic on their own.

Gate

There are new signs on the main school gate reminding parents/carers and children to please not prop this gate open. It is a safeguarding issue which was highlighted again on Wednesday when the gate had been propped open and a child exited the site without permission or their parent.

KS2 Performance letters for Classes 3 and 4

Invite letters were sent out this week for the end of year show. Please let the school office know if you have not received your copy of the letter. Ticket allocation is not automatic, therefore slips need to be returned no later than Friday 30th June.

School Debt Policy – September 2023

This week the school debt for Breakfast Club and After School Club has reached an unprecedented high. As a result we are have made the decision to introduce some tighter measures for the use of these services to eliminate this ongoing issue and maintain zero debt for the school. This change will take effect from the new school year.

Parentpay gives parents/carers the ability to load their child's account in advance and this must be done prior to booking/taking sessions at either Breakfast Club or After School Club. Much the same as our booking system for school lunches, you pay and we then we provide the service. The current practice by some parents/carers of using the clubs and then crediting their accounts some-time after, usually on "pay day" will no longer be acceptable and you will not have access to the services whilst your account is in debt. We hope that this advance notice and the summer holidays will assist you in being able to turn this financial situation around enabling you to be in a position to pay in advance. We have also witnessed a culture of booking a place and then not cancelling that place with the school office, which we are also addressing (all cancellations much be at least 24hrs notice or you will still be charged). The new measures we are introducing from September are as follows.

- Bookings will only be accepted if Breakfast Club and Afterschool Club Accounts are in credit for each day booked.
- If your child is a "no show" or you have not given 24hrs notice, you will be still be charged for your child's place.
- If your child is not booked in for either service, you will be contacted and if we are oversubscribed, asked to collect your child.
- Accounts will be debited on the same day (BC) or next day (ASC) and not weekly.
- Childcare vouchers/tax free childcare payments should be **sent in advance** and your Parentpay account will then be credited ready for use.
- Breakfast club remains free of charge to those eligible for income/benefits based Free School Meals.

There will be updated booking forms for the clubs and these must be completed, signed and handed in prior to the start of the new school year to reserve your place for September.

Class Snippets - (Article 28- children have the right to an education. Article 29- Education should develop a child's talents, personalities and beliefs)

Pre-school – we have fully embraced our theme of "Oh, 1 do like to be beside the Seaside". We have been serving and selling ice-creams at our parlour, using the cones to explore 3D shapes! We have built sandcastles, made our own flags for them and enjoyed lots of water play using bamboo guttering, syringes and toy boats.



Class 1 – This week, the children have been working really hard on their number buddies to 5 and their number recognition. On Wednesday, we played with the parachute on the school field, whilst playing number games. The children showed great number sense and resilience as this is the first time we have played these games. This week in phonics, we have been working on triple consonant blends (spr, str & scr) often found at the beginning of words. We have also been practising our HFWs and this week's words are called, looked and asked.

Class 2 have been creating lovely artwork this week. The children have been developing their own style of matchstick figures based on the work of Lowry. They worked really carefully to include detail in their drawings and create stories about what the figures were doing. They have also continued to create lovely music with Mrs Evans on the theme of friendship. Their lovely singing to 'Count on Me' can be heard throughout the school on Thursday afternoons. This has linked very well to our PSHE topic of community, where they created posters about how we can help our school community to be a better place.

Class 3 - This week, Class 3 have been very creative in writing their own versions of The Elephants in The Walls as a sequel from our class text. The ideas that the children have come up with have been amazing and they are all starting to think more carefully about crafting their writing- well done! In maths, we have been completing NFER assessments. Again, they have all been applying their learning from this year and using methods taught. In history, they have explored Roman leisure and compared activities they did to things we do today.

Class 4 had a great time on their trip this week to Bristol Museum and Art Gallery. The children got to explore Ancient Greek artefacts up close and learnt about the different uses of the pots in Ancient Greek times - they had lots of inspiration for when they create their own! The children received a huge compliment from the workshop leader: she said they were one of the best groups she had ever had and she was very impressed with their art skills. After, the children got to complete quizzes and find artefacts and paintings around the museum and art galleries - time flew by so quickly! There was lots of positive feedback from the class and they enjoyed it more than they expected to, which was great to hear. A big thank you to the volunteers, Dr Tingay, Mrs Dyer and Mr Thomas for giving up their time to come with us. Here are some photos:
