Dear Parents/Carers

Practice Lockdown

The children had their first Lockdown practice on Wednesday of this week, it was just for a few minutes, where children were kept safe within their classrooms for the duration. This practice is a safeguarding requirement for all schools and the children were well prepared for this by the teaching staff. We will be practicing termly going forward to ensure that everyone is comfortable and knows what to do in this situation.

Exciting News for Pre-school!

The school is now in a position to inform you that we have been successful in our bid to secure funding from Gloucestershire County Council to put towards a new Preschool building. This is from both an Early



Year's Expansion Grant and local 106 Development Funding Grant money. The school has also been able to contribute towards this project, having had an historical amount ring fenced for a number of years for this very purpose. The building works should be starting after the Christmas/New Year break, with the first phase being the demolition of the existing building and the whole project is expected to take 12-14 weeks – with a launch date after the Easter Holidays. The expanded setting will then be able to take 2 year olds for which we are already taking names for on our waiting list.

During the project the Pre-school children will temporarily be relocated to the school, utilising Class 2 3/4 (small classroom at the front of the school), the school hall and as usual the children will have access to outside play. As a consequence of the temporary setting, numbers of children attending will be capped for Terms 2/3 at no more than 10 children per day.

We will keep you updated on news that may affect the day to day running of the school whilst the construction work is taking place but we have been assured this will be kept to the minimum possible. To forewarn you, there will be a change to drop and go and the use of the track during that first week of demolition works in January.

Pre-school – the children have enjoyed finding Halloween inspired pictures around the garden and marking them off their tick sheets. We made a spooky face on our pumpkin and played with the seeds and flesh. We have made lots of Magic potions, using coloured water, natural resources and plastic bugs! The children have also made bubbly cauldrons, pumpkin and bat cookies and engaged in lots of dancing and singing, using microphones.

Class 1 – this week the children have been completing book reviews of Coming to England. They all rated the story and identified what they enjoyed most about the book. Reception sounds are (h, b) and HFW's (has, his, him, oh, had, big, mum, up, put). In Geography, we were looking further at where we live and identified that we all live in England and that it rains a lot. We then identified the different animals that we would find in England. We had some great fun with pumpkins at the beginning of the week, using hammers to hammer golf tees into them, then the children began to carve out the pumpkins.

Class 2 have been busy learning about the 7 continents. They played a game to match the continent to its name, labelled them, sang a song and drew animals found in each place. In writing, they have written some brilliant autumn themed poems. They will be entered into a competition being run by local author, Charlotte L Taylor. If you do not wish for your child's poem to be entered please let me know by 7.11.25. It was lovely to see so many children enjoying the disco on Wednesday evening. We also had lots of fun on Tuesday, when Woodside and Soudley visited us for some harvest crafts. The children were very polite/ helpful to their peers and enjoyed making chalk leaf pictures, autumn leaf wreaths and designed a hedgehog for a competition using tissue paper and shapes. Have a restful break!

Class 3 – we've had a fantastic final week! On Monday, we enjoyed two special visitors. First came the Education Life tent, where the children learned all about how amazing our bodies are — with help from Harold the Giraffe! I was so impressed by how engaged they were and how much they remembered from our science lessons. Later, dental hygienist Laura Thompson joined us to talk all things teeth. She was really impressed with the children's enthusiasm and knowledge! In maths, Years 3 and 4 have continued their geometry work, classifying 2D shapes and showing great reasoning skills. In writing, we've explored fronted adverbials through the beautiful stimulus 'Dream Maker', creating some wonderful descriptive pieces. Yesterday, the children rounded off the week with an art day, designing and creating their own printed artwork — a lovely creative finish to a busy term!

Class 4 have had a great week - they have managed to accumulate lots of class stars for trying hard with tasks in class, such as performing their poems, hakas and quizzes. The children have finished their space bags this week and the teachers were impressed with their designs; in Art, the children designed Forest of Dean murals and were able to scale their designs to larger pieces. We hope the children have a lovely half term break and we look forward to welcoming them back for Autumn 2! (Don't forget to complete your moon diaries)
