#### Pre-school Update

Plans are progressing well with the building project for the new Preschool. Here is a picture of what we can expect on completion, this isn't the exact design but will give you an idea of the finish and type of building. Just to let you know, there will be a large storage container delivered within the next 2 weeks, which will take up an area



in the carpark, this unfortunately was the only suitable place to site the unit due to overhead cables.

We have made the decision to move the Pre-school children over to the main school building from Monday 15th **December**. This is to facilitate the stripping out of the current building and also to settle the children into their new environment before January. From Monday 15th December, please could parents/carers of Pre-school children wait by the school main entrance in the playground at drop-off and collection times and a member of staff will be out to greet you all. A reminder also that when we open the new building in April 2026 we will be taking 2 year olds, please contact the school office or Kelly in Pre-school if you would like to register your child. #### Attendance Snippet

#### If my child needs to be absent from school, what do I need to do?

You should contact t school as early as possible on the first day of absence to explain why. If you do not, your child's school will contact you on the first morning of their absence to find out why your child is not in school. All parents can request a 'leave of absence' for their child which gives them permission to be absent from school. Your child's school has the final say over whether to approve the request and for how long your child can be absent. Generally, a leave of absence would not be allowed for a holiday.

# Class Snippets - (Article 28- children have the right to an Education. Article 29- Education should develop a child's talents, personalities and beliefs)

**Pre-school** - we have still been very engaged in The Gingerbread Man story, with a little sprinkle of Christmas sneaking through! The children have created their own gingerbread houses, making marks, adding stickers and have also made fingerprint candy canes. They have continued to really enjoy the gingerbread house role-play, and we have decorated a real Gingerbread house too...yummy! The children have initiated and loved





engaging in Celebration assembly role play all week, complete with teacher chairs and certificates!!

Class 1 – this week in Class 1 we have been looking at teeth and how we look after them. We have conducted an experiment by submerging eggs in coke, lemon juice, apple juice, orange juice and pineapple juice, whilst half of the egg has been covered with toothpaste to see if the toothpaste will protect the shell. In just 2 days, we have seen lots of changes to the eggs and the children have been keen to check them each day. In English we have started our new book Cave Baby and the children thoroughly enjoyed acting out the different animals from the story. Reception sounds ch, sh, th(that) th(thumb) & ng. HFW's (her, was, are, too, yes, that, this, them, then).

**Class 2** have been busy rehearsing for the Christmas play this week. They have done an amazing job at learning their lines and the songs. They are really impressing me. In history, we looked at comparing planes today with a plane Amelia Earhart flew. The children looked at different engines and how fast the planes could travel. In maths, the Y2s have moved onto their geometry unit to explore different 3D shapes and Y1s have been partitioning 8 in different ways. We had a fun day today making smoothies of our own and preparing reindeer food to sell at the Christmas Fayre.

**Class 3** - we've been super busy again this week, and the days just seem to get busier and busier! In Maths, both year groups have now wrapped up their unit on addition and begun their final unit of the term, focusing on multiplication. In Writing, we've been exploring figurative language to help make our work livelier. The children produced a wonderful piece on Egypt, using similes, alliteration, and

even a touch of hyperbole. In PSHE, the class has been learning about character traits and discussing how these qualities help shape who we are. We're very much looking forward to building our castles next week, as well as our exciting trip to the theatre on Wednesday.

Class 4 - this week in Class 4, children have been working on their writing skills with using the passive voice and formal writing - they are getting quite good at identifying the subject, verb and objects in these sentences. In Science, the children have conducted their investigation to see which spherical object created the largest crater, determining that the mass and size of an object often created a larger 'crater' in the sand - lots of them linked their learning to the planetarium show we saw last week at the Thinktank. In Maths, Y6 have been working on calculating fractions and are using a range of skills to add mixed numbers and proper fractions; Y5 have been working on addition and subtraction strategies, both mental and written, and how they can be more efficient with their methods - we have seen some great mathematical thinking skills linked to curiosity, collaboration and resourcefulness.

#### Childrensfund Free School Meals for Christmas Holidays

We would like to make you aware of the holiday Free School Meal (FSM) voucher scheme that Gloucestershire County Council is currently offering to families in Gloucestershire.

Applications for holiday FSM vouchers for the Winter holiday 2025 will be open from midday 25 November until midday on 9 December. Voucher emails will be sent from week commencing 15 December. Please check junk/spam folders during this period as sometimes the vouchers end up there. If parents have not received their vouchers by 22 December, please submit a query via the Microsoft Form HERE

This Winter Holiday, Gloucestershire County Council will provide families in receipt of Free School Meals, who sign up to this offer, with vouchers to assist with food costs during the school holidays. The vouchers are funded through grant funding they have received, and they are separate to that of term time free school meals.

The scheme is for children in reception to year 11 who receive Pupil Premium (benefits-related) free school meals and attend a school in Gloucestershire. We are unable to consider college and sixth form students, nor children who receive infant free school meals (available to all children from reception to year 2) - they are not eligible for this scheme. Families who have signed up to the scheme or who are already registered will receive a total of £15 per child for one week.

Families who have signed up previously do not need to re-register for the Winter holiday vouchers - they will already have been included. Families that have previously signed up will need to contact us with any changes to their circumstances (e.g. if the number of children eligible increases or decreases). To ensure we reach all those who are eligible, we are encouraging parents that have not previously signed up, to sign up as soon as they can.
