# **Class Snippets**

**Pre-school** - this week has been all about Sports Day!! We have been busy doing lots of practising and cheering each other along. We even managed to hold a Superhero Sports Day using smaller versions of our resources. To help the children we have read The Jungle Run - which helps the children with the whole aspect of joining in and having fun. We have also made lovely Fathers' Day cards and talked about all of the special male role models in our lives x

Class 1 - this week we have really been getting stuck into our topic of the seaside. We have been learning all about coasts and what a beach holiday would have looked like in the past. We thought about our favourite things to do at the beach, and we even made dioramas of what a beach can look like. We have loved reading our new book in English 'Oi Frog' and have a lot of fun coming up with funny rhymes for our own rhyming stories based off the book. We have also loved both practicing and participating in Sports Day.

Class 2 - We have been enjoying watching our caterpillars grow this week. They have more than doubled in size and are webbing (which I hear is a good sign). The children have been working scientifically to observe their changes and every few days we record their progress. The Y1s did their phonics screening check this week and worked very hard with their sounding out. They should be very proud of themselves. In PE, we have been practicing for sports day and we are definitely ready for it now! In maths, the Y1s have been working on some multiplication and division strategies; while the Y2s have continued their statistics work - focusing on block diagrams and pictograms.





Class 3 - have had a busy couple of weeks week visiting Woodside and St Whites. On Wednesday last week, the class visited Woodside for a sporting event. They played dodgeball, cricket, archery, golf and got to try curling for the first time. The children all listened well, followed instructions and it was lovely to see how they were such kind friends to other children within the federation. On Thursday last week, we visited St Whites to perform in a music concert. The children played a selection of songs they have been learning on the violin, along with St Briavels school. They again showed their shiny selves and were a credit to the school. The Y4 children have completed their MTC check last week and have been working hard to develop their times tables knowledge. We had a fantastic time at Caerleon Roman museum this week being Roman soldiers for the day and exploring what life would have been like. The children tried on armour, helmets, shields and swords. We visited the Amphitheatre to see where gladiators would have fought.





**Class 4** have had a great first couple of weeks back since half term. The children are continuing their learning about the Ancient Greeks and have been learning about their life back then by analysing pottery. In English, they have been working hard on writing their journalistic reports about Oberon and the events in A Midsummer Night's Dream. Rehearsals are starting now for the KS2 Production of Shakespeare Rocks and the children are looking forward to this production.
