# Sponsored Walk – Friday 26th May

Our annual Sponsored Walk is such a great experience for the children, as well as being a very important fundraising event for FoSM. The money received goes towards the huge cost of the Pantomime Trip, this year booked for 6<sup>th</sup> December for classes 1-4. Please hand in all sponsor money into the school office as soon as possible. We also need to receive the slip which was with the letter to confirm who will be collecting your child from Beechenhurst (The Glade) at approx. 12:30pm.

The route this year is slightly longer, totalling approx. 5 miles as we are having to avoid Forestry works. Forestry England have also asked if shoes/boots/buggies could please be cleaned (of mud and leaf debris) prior to the walk and again after, as part of the need to reduce the spread of tree disease.

As previously requested, please also order a school packed lunch (via ParentPay) if you would like to do so, this is for those children entitled to Free School Meals or Universal Free School Meals only. The meal will be available for you to take away when you collect your child.

There will be no After School Clubs for any children on this day, including Pre-school children and the Prostars Club.

# Class Snippets - (Article 28- children have the right to an education. Article 29- Education should develop a child's talents, personalities and beliefs)

**Pre-school –** the children enjoyed sharing their experiences of the coronation of King Charles III. We have had lots of discussions around the weather – Tuesday's Thunder and lightning especially! We have created buses, planes and trains using loose parts and chairs, making train tickets and looking at maps of the UK and Cinderford.

**Class 1** have been writing facts about different animal groups and how to identify them by their different characteristics. We have been using our phonics knowledge to be as independent as possible when writing and we have all been working hard on our letter formation. In maths we have been looking at the composition of 10, which has been challenging at times, but we are beginning to understand our number bonds.

Class 2 have started learning about time this week in maths. They have picked this up so well and I have been impressed with their retention of o'clock times. I have been challenging them throughout the day to use our clocks to see what the time is. I am very happy to see the great understanding of the big hand showing the minutes and the small hand showing the hours. Next week we are working on half past times and I'm excited to see the progress continue.

**Class 3** have had a busy week working with lots of different supply teachers. Ms Rix told me that the Y4s showed a brilliant knowledge of decimal place value and I saw them enjoying completing Roman Soldier interviews in history. Miss Munden said that they listened very well on Tuesday and

# Free School Meal Scheme - May/June Half Term

For the May/June half term, Gloucestershire County Council (GCC) is providing vouchers to eligible families who have signed up to our Holiday Free School Meals (FSM) scheme. These vouchers are provided by GCC as part of our commitment to 'no child goes hungry'. The vouchers are funded through grant funding we have received and is separate to that of term time free school meals.

The scheme is for children in reception to year 11 who receive benefits-related free school meals and attend a school in Gloucestershire. Families who have signed up to the scheme or who are already registered will receive a total of £15 per child. (Article 24- the right to nutritious food)

**Parents who have signed up previously do not need to re-register -** you will already have been included. To ensure we reach all those who are eligible, we are encouraging parents that have not previously signed up, to sign up as soon as they can.

If you have any updates to an existing application, please email <u>childrensfund@gloucestershire.gov.uk</u> so that we can update your details, as this is not an automatic process.

Applications for Holiday Free School Meal vouchers for the May/June half term are now open until midday 16 May. Voucher emails will be sent out on 22 May. Please check junk/spam email folders during this period as sometimes the vouchers end up there.
