From 1st April, children and young people and staff who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. Adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be 3 days.
