School Uniform

Please could we reiterate the school uniform policy. You can find this and lots of other useful information in our Parent Handbook which can be found on the school website:

Uniform

School Uniform can be purchased from MyClothing or School Trends online.

- Burgundy sweatshirt, jumper or cardigan preferably with school logo
- Black or grey trousers or skirts.
- White shirt or burgundy polo shirt, burgundy T-shirt with school logo for PE.

- Black White or grey socks or tights.
- Burgundy or red and white gingham dress or skirt for girls in the summer.
- Children may wear appropriate black or grey tailored shorts.
- Black shoes must be sensible and robust enough for outside play; no flip-flops or Crocs in the summer, for example.
- We prefer appropriate sports trainers for outside PE rather than daps.

PE Kits

It is essential for hygiene and routine that children have a change of clothing and footwear for all PE sessions. We are finding that children either do not have a kit in school, are missing various items or sometimes have a kit but it is not the correct uniform. We thought it may be helpful to list items needed and please could parents/carers ensure that these are in school **all week** to avoid any confusion. This is a vital part of the school curriculum and as with all subjects' children need to be prepared and ready to learn.

Parent/Carer Checklist

It would be helpful if Parents/Carers could run through a daily checklist before school, to ensure that your child/ren are ready for the school day. This would reduce the amount of phone calls home the school has to make and also reduce anxieties for your child/ren. The school expects the older children to start taking responsibility for some of these things themselves. As an example:



- Lunch booked or packed lunch from home
- Drink bottle
- PE kit or swimming kit when needed
- Homework
- No jewellery
- Reading book
- Correct uniform and coat please ensure all uniform is worn correctly
- No personal/unnecessary items from home

Contact with School/Class Teacher

If you have a class-based query, please contact your child's teacher in the first instance via the school office. Please be assured that teachers will respond, but not necessarily on the same day. Teachers are not expected to respond whilst they are teaching or beyond 5pm; your patience is appreciated.
