Planting

A huge thank you to Mr Drewitt for obtaining a grant for the school to buy and plant 500 wildflower plug plants this week. Mr Drewitt has been working with the children to improve the school grounds and promote wildlife. There is now a 1m wildflower border around the school field and this will continue to develop flowers over the next few years, including:

Knapweed
Field scabious
Lady's bedstraw
Sneezewort
Meadow cranesbill
Common sorrel
Salad burnet
Common violet
Bird's foot trefoil
Devil's bit scabious
Oxeye daisy
Viper's bugloss



He also tells us that there are a pair of house martins nesting under the apex outside Class 4.
