

Class Snippets - (Article 28- children have the right to an education. Article 29- Education should develop a child's talents, personalities and beliefs)

Pre-school – this week at Pre-School, we spoke as a group about all of the fun and exciting things we did during our week off! We have had fun dressing up doing lots of role play, playing with playdough, painting and large-scale drawing. The weather has been up and down this week and we have been outside on bikes and scooters and in the mud kitchen when we have been able to! We have been looking at number 1 and the P sound, finding items that begin with P and using number blocks and maths resources to use 1.

Class 1 – lovely first week back! The children have blown Miss Byrnes away with their half term writing, they did a wonderful job and they are now proudly on display. We have been recalling all of our learning about Neil Armstrong and the first moon landing to support our writing of fact files in English. In Maths, Reception have been looking at 5 as a part to make greater numbers (5 and 3 make 8). This has been a challenging concept, but they have all been working really hard using their new mathematical vocabulary. Exciting Thursday, first we had Yoga, then we had our first computing session. We took it in turns being robots and programmers giving each other codes to follow (instructions). Reception sound Tricky Witch 'oi' and HFW's 'like, what, when, little'.

Class 2 – the children have all settled in well to being back at school. We received some very exciting post this week - from Paddington Bear! He is working with UNICEF to tell us more about children in need and countries around the world. Every month we will be getting a postcard from him as he visits different countries. This month, he has been in London and told us about his home there in Windsor Gardens. We have also been finishing our science topic - Everyday Materials - with a final experiment. We have been testing materials to see if they would be suitable for an umbrella.



Class 3 had a great first week back learning all about our new book *The Lost Happy Endings*. They have used some amazing vocabulary to write character descriptions about the witch and are impressing me with the use of the grammatical features they are including. In science, we have started our new topic on sound and we have explored how humans hear sound and particle vibration. We have also been reading a new book with a poem for each day and *Viking Voyagers* in Guided Reading, to explore the features of non-fiction text.

Class 4 have had a busy week back at school. We have started looking at the poem 'There's a Rang-Tan in My Bedroom' and the children have started to comprehend the impact of deforestation on the Orangutans and other animals within these habitats. In Science, we have shared new knowledge organisers for Evolution and Inheritance in readiness for this upcoming unit of work. Class 4 have been excited to start their art topic; the children have started to look at Henri Rousseau and will be developing their own pieces of work this term. We also won class stars this week so there will be a treat organised soon.
