Dear Parents/Carers,

Class Snippets

Pre-school – The children have collected autumn leaves, using them to create Harvest crowns and used their finger prints to make 'leaves' on an autumn tree. We have enjoyed playdough- where the children have added birthday candles, twigs, shells and sequins, colour by number and dot to dot activities. We have talked about Harvest and the Forest foodbank.

Class 1 - This week we have been learning about Harvest and thinking about why we celebrate it. We have spent our afternoons creating Harvest Wreaths. In phonics this week we have been practising 'e', 'u' and 'r' and have been using our phonics knowledge to help Miss Byrnes spell complex words such as 'underneath' and 'remarkable'.

Class 2 have been working really hard to write a letter about Paddington bear! They made sure to include their adjectives to describe Paddington and to let whoever found him know that he is a very nice bear. They remembered what we had learnt about Paddington over the last few weeks and didn't forget to include his favourite food! They definitely deserve a well-earned rest after their amazing writing.

Class 3 - This week, Class 3 spent a day focusing on history. The children started the day using Now > Press > Play and were acting out a Stone Age hunt. They then wrote a diary in character and these were all amazing! We then explored sources of evidence to categorise foods in the 3 periods of the Stone Age - Palaeolithic, Mesolithic and Neolithic. In the afternoon, we explored farming and how this changed the life of people, including the animals they domesticated and tools they used.

Class 4 have been working hard on writing newspaper reports for their final piece of work based on the text, Goodnight Mr Tom. They have learnt about the Battle of Britain and how the RAF defended the skies after Great Britain refused an Armistice with Germany – we also learnt how pivotal Operation Dynamo was in saving 300,000+ troops from
