maths skills to write how many children were in class each day and to do the calendar. All children have been given a Christmas booklet to complete over the Christmas holidays.

Class 2 – in Phonics Year 2 have been working on suffixes and contractions and Year 1's have been learning ew (cool blue). In Maths Year 1 have been doing addition and subtraction facts for 10 and Year 2 have been counting in steps of 3, repeated addition and multiplication. Excellent rehearsals again for the Nativity performance and they are all looking forward to performing for you next week.

Class 3 - we've had another fantastic week! The children have completed their information texts based on this term's science learning and have enjoyed reading an adapted version of Dickens' A Christmas Carol, particularly exploring the character of Ebenezer Scrooge. Both year groups have now finished their maths units for the year—well done! We also welcomed Charlotte L. Taylor on Tuesday to learn about the legend of Grýla and create our own comic strips. To top it off, we've been practising our songs for next week's carol concert, and the festive excitement is building!

Class 4 have been writing their final pieces in English this week, with explanations of how their Mars Rover designs work, and with an introductory paragraph. The children have tried hard to use upscale language and have considered what capabilities their robots will need; their final pieces have been looking great! In Geography, they have been using grid references to crack codes and in Science, they have started to use their learning to write their own non-chronological reports about Space. During PE, they were testing their hear rates at different stations to see which type of exercise caused their heart rate to rise the most. The children were set Homework last week to invite parents to a show and share next Thursday 18th December at 2.30pm. Please come and join us to see what the children have achieved this term!
