Class Snippets - (Article 28- children have the right to an education. Article 29- Education should develop a child's talents, personalities and beliefs)

Pre-School -this week at Pre-School we have been focussing a lot on ourselves and our families. We have looked at our features using a mirror and have painted the most beautiful self-portraits. We have also talked about who lives in our house with us and have drawn our families and pets! The children have created hand print tree's and used finger painting to add the leaves. We have played outdoors on the bikes and scooters, built a train track altogether and took part in our Wednesday morning music session where we met Charlie the Cello. Our sound has been i and our number has been 5.

Class 1 – busy week for the children in Class 1 as we have started writing in our English books for our book, 'I am Henry Finch'. The children have written about their feelings and have offered advice on how to un-muddle our thoughts. In phonics we have learnt 'o,c,k,ck' and 'to, into, go, no, the' as this week's HFW's. Our topic has been about heroes and we have been looking at heroes of the community and our own personal heroes in our lives.

Class 2 – this week we have been continuing to work on Lubna and Pebble. We have been focusing on verbs and creating short sentences to advise what we can do when we are sad. The children also showed some great sequencing skills. The Y1s have learnt I-e, e-e and o-e in phonics, while the year 2s have looked at homophones. In maths, both year groups have been looking at 2D shapes this week. The children also enjoyed trying food from around the 4 countries of the UK on Tuesday afternoon - I'm sure you have been told about this lesson!

Class 3 have been working hard in maths this week. The Y4 children have moved onto work on properties of triangles and have made different types of triangles in groups, using string. The Y4 children have amazed me with their work on comparing and ordering 3-digit numbers. In writing, they have learnt about compound sentences and made warning posters about aliens! They continue to impress me weekly with their progress at swimming and increased water confidence.

Cheltenham Literature Festival

Class 3 had a fantastic trip to the literature festival last week with Soudley and Woodside Schools on their Federation Trip. They heard from the author Ben Miller, who also appeared in Paddington 2! They learnt about what inspired him to write, listened to an extract from his new book and asked him some questions. Harper asked an excellent question! The children were a pleasure to take and represented the school incredibly well.





Class 4 have made some brilliant progress in DT with their Morse code machines this week! They have enjoyed joining creativity with science to bring their ideas to life. During English, we have explored newspaper reports and their features including creating our own quotes based on our class book in preparation for writing their own newspaper reports. Year 5 have been applying their mathematical knowledge of negative numbers to real world situations such as temperature changes. Year 6 have been looking at factors and multiples this week moving on to an investigation in to what all the prime numbers up to 100 are! They have all worked hard this week and shown a great level of not only understanding but ability to apply previous knowledge to current learning.
