



Class 1 – busy week this week as we've started with our formal phonics and maths lessons. In maths we have been looking at a new skill called subitising and we have been subitising up to 3. We have also been looking at what smaller numbers can fit inside the quantity of 5 (composition of 5). In phonics we have learnt 4 new sounds (s,a,t,p) and 3 High Frequency Words HFW's, which are (a, at, as). Your children should have come home with reading books this week. They may have words such as tap and pat for your children to have a go at sounding out and blending or they are picture books which should be used in a way to encourage your children to think about what is happening in the story to support them making links between ideas, which is really helpful for the development of their comprehension.

Class 2 – have been having a wonderful maths week this week. The Year 1s have been beginning to look at number lines and estimating where numbers lie. They have enjoyed playing maths games and creating number lines using themselves as numbers. The Year 2s have been partitioning numbers into 2-digit numbers and writing numbers as numerals and words. They have been fantastic!

Class 3 had an exciting visit to Cheddar Gorge this week. They explored Gough's Cave, where they saw a replica of the bones of Cheddar Man who was found in the cave. The children learnt about advantages and disadvantages of living in a cave. We met a Stone Age man, who let us explore some artefacts from the Stone Age, hold flint and showed us how they used to light a fire. The children listened well and were a pleasure to take on a trip. Class 4 – this week in Maths, Class 4 have been deepening their number and place value knowledge by identifying, recognising and comparing numbers up to one million (Year 5) and understanding negative numbers (Year 6). We have put more emphasis on using resources to help with concrete understanding and ensure they have a good basis for them to build upon. In English we have been exploring the thoughts and feelings of the characters encountered so far in our text 'Goodnight Mr Tom'. This has involved putting themselves 'in the character's shoes' so they can consider how and evacuees in World War 2 may have felt when they first met their new family in the countryside. This bought about great discussions and ideas.

School Debt Policy - September 2024

Please ensure that your Breakfast Club and After School Club ParentPay accounts are in credit at all times

Just to remind parents and inform new parents of our Debt Policy.

- Bookings will only be accepted if Breakfast Club and Afterschool Club Accounts are in credit for each day booked.
- If your child is a "no show" or you have not given 24hrs notice, you will be still be charged for your child's place.
- If your child is not booked in for either service, you will be contacted if we are oversubscribed, asked to collect your child.
- Accounts will be debited on the same day (BC) or next day (ASC) and not weekly.
- Childcare vouchers/tax free childcare payments should be **sent in advance** and your Parent Pay account will then be credited ready for use.
- Breakfast club remains free of charge to those eligible for income/benefits based Free School Meals.
