
Cookery Club – Tuesday 16th September

We are holding Parents Evenings on Tuesday 14th October & Wednesday 15th October. Bookings for classes 1, 2, 3 and 4 are made via our eSchools system which will be open for booking from **today at 3pm**. The meetings are in 10 minute slots, please adhere to this time limit. Pre-school Parents Evenings will be on the same days, bookings can be made with the Pre-school staff.

Pre-school - The children have been talking about their own families, looking at their family photos and discussing how they are different and similar. They enjoyed making Face cookies- adding yummy treats for their features, such as sprinkles for hair, chocolate chips and marshmallows. We have loved our first session at Forest school today, exploring the site, climbing the trees and jumping in lots of muddy puddles on the way back!

Class 1 - The children of Class 1 are still working hard on getting used to the routines of school and Class 1. We have been looking a lot at The Colour Monster and what feelings we can feel. The children have been encouraged to use their new emotional language when expressing themselves in Class.

Class 2 have settled in beautifully to the routine of school. They access fine motor activities when they first coming into school. This includes tweezer games, threading cards, tracing, hammer patterns and stick patterns. We have started phonics this week. Y1s have been working on ff, ss, II and ck sounds and the Y2s have explored dge and g tricky witch as a j sound. It would be great to explore words with these sounds in together at home. In maths, the Y1s have been counting to 20 and exploring how to make those numbers with tens frames. Please practise counting to 20 - this could be counting objects on a nature walk or around the house. Y2 children have been exploring 2 digit numbers, including writing and partitioning them using dienes. We were cartographers in geography to make sketch maps of the school and we went on a material hunt in science.

Class 3 have made a brilliant start to the new school year, throwing themselves into their learning with enthusiasm. In maths, Year 3 have been exploring 3-digit numbers while Year 4 have tackled 4-digit place value with confidence. Our writing sessions have focused on different types of adverbs and how to use them effectively, alongside orally retelling our class text, Hortense and the Shadow. In art, we've been developing our 3D sketching skills using shading techniques. The children have made me feel incredibly welcome at Steam Mills, and I've thoroughly enjoyed getting to know them. It's also been lovely to meet some of you already—please do feel free to say hello at drop-off or pick-up!

Class 4 have had a positive start to our new academic year. We have started learning about Space and we are enjoying the texts we are exploring linked to this - Hidden Figures and When the Stars Come Out. In DT, the children are learning about sewing techniques so they can design their own space bag and they have created some lovely art work linked to stars last week. In PE, we are learning about the Haka, which links to the current Women's Rugby World Cup and they have come up with some great moves and warrior stances. We are looking forward to what the rest of the term has in store and what the children produce! ①

One-way System

Please could we remind Parent/Carers that the school runs a one-way system. Cars leaving the main car park should exit via the track and cars entering the car park should do so via the main car park entrance. This is in place to avoid any cars meeting head-on. There was a near miss this week with a car entering the car park via the track, whilst a car was trying to exit. The school does not take responsibility for any accidents in these public areas.

School Debt Policy - September 2025

Please ensure that your Breakfast Club and After School Club ParentPay accounts are in credit at all times.

Just to remind parents and inform new parents of our Debt Policy.

- Bookings will only be accepted if Breakfast Club and Afterschool Club Accounts are in credit for each day booked.
- If your child is a "no show" or you have not given 24hrs notice, you will be still be charged for your child's place.
- If your child is not booked in for either service, you will be contacted if we are oversubscribed, asked to collect your child.
- Accounts will be debited on the same day (BC) or next day (ASC).
- Childcare vouchers/tax free childcare payments should be **sent in advance** and your Parent Pay account will then be credited ready for use.
- Breakfast club remains free of charge to those eligible for income/benefits based Free School Meals.
