## Breakfast Club and After School Club Expansion from September

As part of the national wraparound childcare programme and the Government's ambition that by 2026, all parents and carers of primary school-aged children who need it will be able to access term time childcare in their local area from 8am-6pm, we are expanding our After School Club until 6pm from September. The programme will enable parents to work a full day with travel time. To reflect this expansion we will have extra places and our timings/ charges have been adjusted, as follows:

## **Class Snippets**

**Pre-school** - we have shared more seaside themed stories including Commotion in the Ocean and Ben and Holly's Trip to the Seaside. The children have used beach themed subitising cards to match amounts to numerals 1-5. We have made lovely mermaid pictures using colour by number and enjoyed painting with watercolours. We continue to enjoy lots of sand and water play in this lovely weather.



**Class 1** – at the start of this week class one had another brilliant bump up morning in class two and are now very excited for next year. We then had a fantastic time visiting the beach. It was a lovely day at Weston, paddling in the sea, finding shells, building sandcastles and even having an ice cream. It was amazing. Back in class we then made some beautiful paintings of the beach using watercolours, thinking about what our favourite part of the trip was. We have also continued enjoying our story 'The Lighthouse Keepers Lunch' in English, thinking about what we would want to have in our lunch. In phonics this week we have continued working on sounding and blending to read longer words and our high frequency words were (Mr, Mrs, don't).

**Class 2** – what a wonderful week we've had! A huge THANK YOU to all the parents and staff who supported on our trips over the last week! We had a great day last Friday at the SS Great Britain - we got to dress up in Victorian clothes, use ink pens to write and play with Victorian toys! On Thursday, this week we went to Weston beach and had a wonderful day! We got to dip our toes in the sea and get very messy with sand. Thank you also to all of the parents who attended our butterfly assembly on Wednesday; the children performed some poetry and songs, as well as reading a story. We then released our butterflies with the rest of the school watching!



**Class 3** have enjoyed writing and sharing their own stories this week based on The Wolves in the Walls. We had stories about elephants, lions, cats and eagles. They loved reading them to their tables and used lots of narrative features. We explored the Rebellion of Boudicca in history and wrote newspaper reports about this event. The children amazed me with their knowledge of newspapers and applied their skills from English in this writing. In yoga, they got to make up their own poses and everyone had to try them out. We had another busy week rehearsing songs for the KS2 play. On Thursday, we were very lucky to have a visit from local author, Charlotte L Taylor, who helped us write our own nature inspired poems. The children write haikus and rhyming poems that will be entered into the Bream Book Festival, with the chance to win a book voucher prize. Entries will be judged on Sunday 17th August at the festival. If you do not wish for your child's poem to be entered, please let Mrs Gibbs know by 11th July.

**Class 4** have invested a lot of time this week in to play rehearsals - some children have done really well with covering roles when others have not been here, which has been lovely to see. Some of our Y6s have been at their new secondary schools this week and have thoroughly enjoyed themselves. In Science, we investigated heart rates when the children were doing dynamic or static exercises and they learnt how to count their pulse... when they found them! The children wrote the next chapter in the Odyssey for Odysseus' adventure after the Laestrygonian Island and they had some very creative ideas and the Greek theme continued in Art where the children decorated their Greek pots and vases - they were very proud of them.

# Parent/Carer Checklist
