# Class Snippets - (Article 28- children have the right to an education. Article 29- Education should develop a child's talents, personalities and beliefs)

**Pre-school** – this week the children have enjoyed running their very own ice cream shop, using real and pretend cones, ice cream scoops, a till and money, and talking about their favourite flavours. They have been using lots of mathematical language when serving each other, and have shared the space and taken turns with the resources. We have also decorated sandcastles with small shells and used our fingers and cotton buds in paint to decorate beach huts and other seaside pictures.

**Class 1** – the children have been working hard on their pirate guides this week. We have been writing what a pirate needs, what a pirate is like and what we like most about them. In maths, reception have been recapping numbers to 10, more specifically 5 and a bit. We have been using tens frames and rekenreks to explore this and to consolidate our understanding. As a whole class we have been looking at the seaside and coasts, following on from our learning about the United Kingdom.

**Class 2** - this week in our swimming session, the focus was on water safety and the prevention of drowning. The swim teachers taught the children what to do if they are in unsafe water and the children demonstrated this skill by lying like a starfish on their back in the pool. This was unnerving for some of the less confident swimmers; however, all of the children tried their very best and showed great resilience. The children also looked at images of unsafe or safe scenarios near water and discussed why it was safe/unsafe. We have also been working hard this week in our NFER/SATs papers and all children have demonstrated such great growth mindset!

**Class 3** had a fantastic day learning all about mining in the forest. They visited Clearwell in the morning to explore iron and ochre mining and got to experience what life would have been like climbing through tight tunnels, holding the weight of a 'billy' on their back and holding some rock

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containing iron. In the afternoon, they visited Hopewell to experience a coal mine. The children got to see what it was like for a child working at the coal face in a tight space and turned their lamps off to find out how dark it was. They were able to ask some excellent questions, showing their engagement with the topic. It was lovely to share this same trip on the same day with the other Y3/4 children from the Forest Federation. **Class 4** - in Science this week, the children were learning about how to separate materials (solids, liquids and gases) and how they could do this effectively with the resources provided. They completed this effectively and said they all tried a method they would never have thought to use – there were some excellent diagrams drawn to show this. We have been looking at the Literacy Shed video, Chaperon Rouge (a darker, futuristic version of Red Riding Hood) and Class 4 did a great job writing from the perspective of the wolf. Y5 and Y6 have been trying really hard with their writing over the last few weeks and we are very proud of what they have managed to achieve.

Yesterday, Class 4 took part in our Sports federation event. It was a lovely afternoon which all the children very much enjoyed. Teachers from all 3 schools commented on how well they all interacted with each other and all children there showed exceptional learning behaviours - using our 5 rules to shine! It was so nice to see them all leaving smiling and happy they had met lots of new people or even made new friends
