AiP Meal Price Increase

Our caterers (Alliance in Partnership) have given notice of a price increase from **September 2024**. The meal price will be increased to **£2.75** per meal – meals will remain free of charge to those on means tested Free School Meals and Universal Free School Meals (Years R-2). The school understands the increase is brought about by food inflation and ongoing increases in labour costs; we feel that this price still offers good value for the quality of the meals served each day.

Breakfast Club/After School Club

Please note that if you are late collecting your child from school, they will be put in After School Club (ASC). If they are at ASC for more than 10 minutes, the



minimum charge will be made. Also, just to reiterate the procedure for drop off and collection of children before or after school (this also applies if you are late collecting your child). Please ring the hall bell on the main school gate, staff will then release the gate and you walk around to the BC/ASC door at the back of the school and ring the bell there to collect your child. Occasionally, in the summer, collection from ASC will be from the playground if the children are playing outside, you will need to make yourself seen/heard from the gate. Also, sometimes on a Monday or Friday, ASC is running in the Zoom Room at the front of the school, due to Prostars being in the hall, on these occasions, you will need to ring the office, rather than the hall to be let in. During our INSET day before half term Staff were able to discuss how proud we are of the behaviour of our pupils. We have developed 5 rules that we can use in every class throughout our federation. Mrs Davis met up with school council members from each school who were able to share ideas from our pupils. Staff also shared ideas. These are the 5 rules that we have all had the opportunity to contribute towards and will be using in school from now on. Please ask your child what the rules are and remind them of our expectations, thank you.



Class Snippets - (Article 28- children have the right to an education. Article 29- Education should develop a child's talents, personalities and beliefs)

Pre-school – the children have been very excited by the growth progress of their beans, using lots of lovely mathematical language when making observations and comparing with each other. We have embraced our new theme of "I do like to be beside the seaside" sharing stories, using Seaside inspired props and pictures to extend play. The children have been subitising - using shells and fish - matching quantity to numbers up to 6. We have been busy practising for Sports Day, using the story 'The Jungle Run' to talk about the importance of joining in and having fun! We have also started to make Father's Day cards and talk about what we love most about our daddies.

Class 1 – busy first week back, we have started our new English book, The Night Pirates. We have been using this book to write lists for pirates and to write captions for different events in the story. In maths we have been looking at patterns within numbers to 10, such as doubles and number bonds. In Geography we have been looking closely at the 4 countries of the United Kingdom and the capital cities. In phonics, Reception have been looking at compound words and our HFW's are 'old, very, I'm'.

Class 2 - we have had such a lovely first week back! We have begun a writing unit based on the text Wolves by Emily Gravett; during our lessons we explored what we already know about wolves, sorted books into fiction and non-fiction and decided if statements about wolves were fact or fiction. Over the next week, we will be writing a fact file about wolves based on our knowledge. We have also begun reading The Magic Finger in reading comprehension. The children have used their prediction, inference and vocabulary skills this week. They are enjoying this book very much! Mrs Evans has also begun a 3-week forest schools' session with Class 2. A very busy first week back!

Class 3 had a brilliant time at gymnastics this week. They listened well to the coaches and all tried their best. Some children even surprised themselves with trying new equipment. We have started our new guided reading book, Amazing Africa and explored the features of non-fiction texts. In maths, Y3 children are continuing their work on time and have been writing digital times. Y4 children have been using multiplication knowledge to x1000 converting litres to ml. We have 3 more violin sessions left this term. Parents/ carers are welcome to join us on Wednesday 26th June at 11:15am for a short performance to showcase their learning.

Class 4 - this week C4 have had a good week! They were lucky enough to access a live webinar from the Eden Project where they learnt lots, but were also able to show off their learning about Rainforests from the Spring Term. They saw giant bamboo, and learnt it can grow between 40 and 80 cm in a day; a sensitive plant that curls up when touched to protect itself so it looks less appetising to eat; and most importantly, that there are different coloured bananas, including, blue, pink and ice-cream flavoured ones! They learnt about more ways they could look after their environments, linked to world environment day. They have also started a new unit of English, and are analysing speeches and how they can be made more effective, and in DT they are starting to design their own Maya masks. A very busy, exciting week to kick start Summer 2. Please can we ask parents to return the medical forms asap for the residential!
