Christmas Post Boxes



Pre-School – Christmas has taken over Pre-School! Last Friday we decorated Pre-School and put the tree up, the children loved it and had a great afternoon working as a team to put tinsel and baubles around the tree's outside and the beautiful tree inside. We have been practising lots for our Nativity next week singing lots of songs and getting up on the stage. The Christmas crafts have begun, making cards and calendars along with writing and drawing on our Christmas craft table. Our sound this week has been i and our number has been 1.

Class 1 - the children have been preparing for a 'parade' this week for our English topic. The parade was to invite people to celebrate the night spirit. We used decorations, music and singing to celebrate. The children loved the Panto trio on Wednesday, they came back ecstatic when telling Miss Byrnes all about it! Just 1 sound this week 'oo' for poo. HFW's are 'them, then, that, this, said'.

Class 2 – this week has been a bit of a blur in Class 2! The children have had a very fun week. We have spent most of our time rehearsing for the nativity and are very excited to show this to you next week. The children also enjoyed their pantomime workshop on Tuesday afternoon; some of the children got to dress up as the characters and we understood the story of Aladdin before the trip on Wednesday. The children were so well behaved and had such a wonderful time on Wednesday. Thank you so much to FOSM for providing this for us again this year and thank you to all the parents who volunteered time to come with us.







Class 3 have worked hard for a range of adults this week. They began to explore features of instructions in readiness to write them next week and have moved on to subtraction in maths. At swimming, the children have all been trying their best to make good progress in their groups, with some moving up! The children enjoyed the Panto on Wednesday, particularly the flying carpet! A big thank you to FOSM for organising and funding this lovely experience.

Class 4 have had a rather busy week! In Science, they were exploring the concept of air resistance and how this is can be helpful or unhelpful, depending on the circumstance - they were able to

make parachutes of varying sizes for their investigation, and test which one had the best air resistance and why. The children have dipped in to the Holocaust this week and the impact that it had on many people's lives; it provided many opportunities for the children to reflect on differences and the lessons learned from this. We had the Panto on Wednesday and the children really enjoyed it - lots of them said it was the best one yet and they were amazed at how Aladdin flew on his carpet - thank you to FoSM and the parent helpers for making this happen ① Yesterday, the Y6s had 20 teachers from Mrs Thomas' Problem Solving: Research and Innovation Work Group watching their maths lesson - they were AMAZING! The adults were super impressed with their knowledge, their learning attitudes and behaviour... The children were an absolute credit to this school and did so well to learn with such a large audience; Mrs Thomas was so proud of them - well done Year 6!

Look Who's Talking!

Steam Mills have entered a competition to encourge their children to practice their oracy skills. Lots of children were excited about this opportunity when it was shared in assembly and details will have been sent home with your child about this competition.



Our school is very excited to be taking part in the 'Look Who's Talking!' competition, along with lots of other schools in Gloucestershire!

What is oracy and why is it so important?

Oracy is the ability to express ourselves clearly and communicate with others effectively, through spoken language.

By teaching our children to become more effective speakers and listeners, we are all helping to give them the tools they need to better understand themselves, each other and the world around them.

How will the competition work?

Your child will get the chance to talk to their class for two minutes, about any subject that they choose and then a 'Star Speaker' will be chosen. Star Speakers from every class will then get to talk in front of the whole school. Those winners will then go on to the next stage and will represent our school in the competition, with lots of other local schools! The grand final will be on 04.04.25, which you can come to, if your child is a representative for our locality.

what can your child talk about?

Children can talk about <u>absolutely anything</u> that they choose to, for up to two-minutes They can use any props that they wish to, which will help with their talk, but just cannot use any technology, so no Powerpoints slide shows please.

How can you help them at home?

- * First of all, please help them to think about what they would like to talk about. The more interested they are in the subject, the more passionate their talk will be! What are they interested in? What excites them? It might be a toy, their pet, a book, something they have seen on TV, their favourite sports team, something they have learned about from you at home or anything else! It really can be anything at all! ** They will need to plan and rehearse their speech, so please listen to them practice and give them lots
- They will need to plan and renearse their speech, so please listen to them practice and give them lot of encouragement!
- Make sure they are speaking with big voices, nice and clearly, so everyone can hear their talk and learn about their chosen topic.
