This year, EYFS and KS1 children will celebrate Elmer day on Thursday 22nd May. They will be completing Elmer themed activities in their classes on this day and we encourage children to wear a brightly coloured item, in addition to their normal school uniform on this day e.g. bright coloured socks, bright headband. If your child has any Elmer books at home, they are welcome to bring them to school on this day to share with their class.

## Class Snippets

**Pre-school** - our story this week has been, What the Ladybird Heard.... We have talked about the different animals in the story, maps and directions. We have been keeping a daily check on our beans and watering them and have also enjoyed lots of water play and sensory play in shaving foam this week. We have just returned from Forest school, where the children have been climbing trees, racing and chasing and have also been very interested in tree bark and moss, asking lots of questions.

**Class 1** – this week we have been continuing our learning around Izzy Gizmo. We have written letters of encouragement to Izzy thinking about how we could cheer someone up when they wanted to give up. We also thought about what tools Izzy might use to build her inventions writing lists of what she may need. In maths we have loved learning how to use the Rekenreks and making patterns on them. In phonics we have continued looking at CVCC words with our learnt digraphs with the HFW (here, your, saw).

**Class 2** – this week Class 2 have been learning all about the Victorian era and the toys that Victorians would've had. We compared the toys and discussed what materials they would've been made of. The children really impressed me by remembering our autumn topic of everyday materials. In English, they have been using but and because in sentences to expand their ideas. This week in maths, the year ones have begun learning about time. They have started the topic by thinking about the days of the week and the months of the year; they ordered these in chronological order. The year two have continued to work with money; They have been adding different amounts and subtracting by calculating the change. We have been amazed to see how quickly our sunflowers have been growing. In only two weeks lots of the plants have grown taller than 5 cm. We have been keeping a diary of the growth every week.

**Class 3** explored mosaics this week with a visit from local artist Rachel Shilston. They got to handle mosaics that she has made, using tiles, shells, sea glass and mirrored tiles. The children were inspired by her talk and are looking forward to making mosaic photo frames next week. A big thank you to FOSM for funding this activity and workshop.

In maths, the Y3's have been working on time, reading both analogue and digital clocks. It would be beneficial to practice this skill at home with your child. The Y4's have been working on writing decimals and fractions. They will also be working on time in the next few weeks so it would be great to explore 12 and 24 hour digital clocks at home.



**Class 4** have had a very busy week. Year 6 have completed their SATs and we have been very proud of them. They have tried really hard and showed lots of resilience - whatever the outcomes, they have been absolutely amazing and should be really proud of themselves. Y5 have worked well this week in the hall and have been a great support to Y6 throughout. In the afternoons, the children have had lots of opportunities to learn with History on Monday and key events that happened in the Ancient Greek period, circuits on Tuesday where they tried to improve their agility and speed and yesterday, they had fun playing Rounders! A great week overall - we hope you all have a lovely, well-deserved weekend in the sunshine!

### STEM

Last week, the children enjoyed taking part in a STEM workshop. They used VR headsets to explore Stone Age and dinosaurs, robo drawing to programme a robot to draw shapes and use iPads to control robotic cars. The children used problem solving skills in this session and experienced a wide range of technology.

KS2 will be marking History Day and KS2 Parents/Carers are welcome to attend school from 2.30pm to see what the children create etc.
