Rights Respecting


This week, each class has had the opportunity to discuss issues around climate change and how this will have an impact on children's rights. They have then voted on climate issues important to them. This vote is part of the COP26 summit in Scotland in November. We have discussed how Articles 12 and 13 link to having the right to vote on issues important to them. Children explored how the impact of climate change may make it difficult for children to access education, clean water and clean air.
