Rags 2 Riches Collection – 12th May 2025



Class Snippets

Pre-school – the children have had lots of Easter fun this week creating Easter baskets, decorating eggs and the Easter Bunny left eggs in our garden today for us to find! We have danced to lots of Easter themed songs, including Techno versions of "Hop Little Bunnies" by Lenny Pearce and DJ Raphi, which has been a big hit!



Class 1 – we have enjoyed making the most of the sunshine for this final week of term spending lots of time playing and learning outside. We finished up our English topic looking at 'I will not ever NEVER eat a tomato ready for a new text next term. We sadly had our last aymnastics session this week but have really enjoyed getting to explore all the different gym equipment. We have also been busy with some Easter activities this week including an egg hunt and card making. Hopefully everyone has a restful holiday ready for the summer term.

Class 2 - this week we have had a lot of fun! We have still been busy with maths and phonics; however, we have been doing some activities instead of our usual English lessons. We created a travel leaflet for Australia to support the end of our topic. The children thought carefully about what we had learnt this term to describe where Australia is in the world, as well as give some top tips for if you were going! In science, they used their knowledge of habitats to guess animals based on clues they had been given. To end the term, we made Easter egg cakes and did an egg hunt!

Class 3 had an egg-siting week writing Easter poems. They amazed me with their knowledge about different types of poems that we have explored through the year and then wrote their own examples. The children applied their colour mixing knowledge to make an Easter card. In maths the Y3 children have completed their work on money and Y4 children continued their work on decimals. I hope you all have a lovely Easter holidays and enjoy some sunshine!

Class 4 have completed their learning on Rivers this week and have really showcased their knowledge. They had walkabout bingo to check and compare their knowledge and have produced some great non-chronological reports, with pictures and a glossary. In Maths, Y5 have started learning about fractions and Y6s have been calculating percentages - we had teachers in from another school yesterday and they were really impressed with the children and their learning - in particular how they use the resources to help them. Swimming is now finished for Class 4 and the children really enjoyed their last session. To note, next term the children will have PE on a Tuesday afternoon and on Fridays - please ensure their kits are in on those days and this will be for the entire Summer Term. Enjoy the break Class 4 you have earned it!
