## Class Snippets

**Pre-school** – our story this week has been **Were going on a Bear hunt**, we have recalled the story and sequenced some pictures in story order, engaged in our own Bear Hunt's- firstly with small world play- using rice for snow, water and bark for squelchy mud. Today we have been on a Bear hunt on a larger scale, using material for the different parts of the journey. We have really enjoyed watching a very animated Michael Rosen tell the story, complete with actions and sound effects! For Elmer Day we have created our own patchwork elephants and spotted characters from the stories on an Elmer hunt in the garden, with the children ticking off each animal as they have found them.

**Class 1** – this week in class one we wrapped up our English focused on 'Izzy Gizmo' by designing inventions of our own that could help animals with different problems. We have also really enjoyed celebrating Elmer day thinking about all the things that make us unique and how we can be a good friend to everyone. In phonics we have been looking at CCVVCC and our HFW time, out, about, house.

**Class 2** – this week in Class 2 we have been completing our guidebooks about 'How to Look After a Dragon'. This has finished our sequence of lessons based on the text Dragon Post and the children have really enjoyed this term's book. On Monday, many children brought in a toy to compare them to Victorian toys. The children generated some ideas about how toys have changed over time - for example, toys in the Victorian times did not use electricity and may not have been as colourful as modern toys. We have also been thinking carefully about what plants need to be healthy. The children created a life cycle of a plant - using some very important vocabulary of 'germination' and 'seed dispersal'. We have been very busy!

**Class 3** had a brilliant Roman day on Tuesday. They dressed as Romans and the costumes were fantastic! The children enjoyed code cracking using Roman numerals and explored the link between Latin and English words. They were amazed by the word Porcus meaning pig. We also explored artefacts and created our own mini-museum in the afternoon to share with parents. In art, the children finished their mosaic animal in the style of Gaudi and designed their mosaic photo frames. In maths, the

Year 6 have also been lucky enough to go and meet Matt Goodfellow, the author of *The Final Year*, and they really enjoyed it and found it very interesting. A very busy half term!
