#### Harvest Festival Assembly/FoSM Non-school Uniform Day – 23rd October

We will also be holding a Harvest Festival Assembly on Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> October at 2:40pm, all Parents/Carers are welcome. Collection of children will then be at the normal time (3:00pm for Preschool and 3:15pm for C1-4) from your usual collection point.

This day will also be a non-school uniform day and FoSM are asking for donations of bottles for the Christmas Fayre bottle tombola please, rather than the usual £1.

Class Snippets - (Article 28- children have the right to an education. Article 29- Education should develop a child's talents, personalities and beliefs)

**Pre-school** – this week in Preschool we have enjoyed using lots of fallen autumn leaves and other natural resources to create face pictures, make Autumn tree suncatchers and just generally investigate and discuss the many lovely colours and textures. We have been eating some yummy apples from our own garden for snacks and the children also used their fine motor skills to ice owl features onto large marshmallows to create some owl babies, linked to the story.

Class 1 – this week Class 1 have been reading Owl Babies for their English topic. The children have been sequencing key events from the story and then retelling the story through pictures. Reception sounds this week (i, n) and HFW's (is, it, an, in). In maths we have been practising our counting skills by helping Freddy Fox to understand useful strategies to count successfully. In the afternoons we have been looking at historical pictures of Steam Mills Primary School and the children recognised that the pictures were old and that some structures of the building were different compared to more up to date pictures.

**Class 2** have had a busy week. In phonics the Y1s have been learning oi, ay and oy. The Y2s have been learning wr and kn as silent letters. They really impressed me in maths this week with finding 1 more for Y1s and 10 more for Y2s. In geography we sang the ocean song to learn the 5 names of the oceans. We have also had a visit from a creature that has left behind green fur! We described a monster and created our own wanted posters to find it!

Class 3 – we kicked off with a *gross-but-great* science lesson, creating a working model of the digestive system. The children were both amazed and a little disgusted—but their brilliant use of scientific vocabulary was impressive! In writing, they've crafted alternative viewpoint stories inspired by *Hortense and the Shadow*. In maths, Year 3 have been exploring 10s and 100s in 3-digit numbers, while Year 4 have been rounding up to 4-digit numbers. The class has also been earning stars for their fantastic listening, kindness, and teamwork—a wonderful week all round!

Class 4 - this week Class 4 had a visitor from one of our local churches as part of our Religion and world views topic. This was an active and insightful visit where the children made Trinity circles and understood how we are all part of one puzzle – each part is of equal importance. This did not just teach us about Christianity but helped us to link ideas of how Christians live not being that dissimilar to our own ways of life and morals such as kindness, thinking of others and respect. In English, the class have considered which of the inspiring women from NASA's history they will be writing a memoir as (Katherine Johnson, Mary Jackson or Dorothy Vaughan). They have also been further perfecting their Haka dances in PE with some great facial expressions to go along with the moves they have learnt!

#### **Parent/Carer Checklist**

It would be helpful if Parents/Carers could run through a daily checklist before school, to ensure that your child/ren are ready for the school day. This would reduce the amount of phone calls home the school has to make and also reduce anxieties for your child/ren. The school expects the older children to start taking responsibility for some of these things themselves. As an example:
