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MAND AVOIDAN

Parent & Carer Session

Are you finding that your child has regular meltdowns?

Have you tried to use Autism "friendly" strategies to support their behaviour?

Does your child want to control many aspects of their day?

Children with increasing levels of demand avoidant tendencies are being engaged with across all education and home settings, many of these young people have diagnosis of Autism. Often parents, carers and support staff are trying the usual behaviour and support techniques that are associated with autism and learning difficulties such as praise, reward charts, consequences with many of these exacerbating the situations further and leading to meltdowns and outbursts.

There is a growing notion that terminology such as Autism with Demand Avoidance Behaviours is being provided as a label to young people to help support the staff and signpost to a varied set of strategies to help engage and empower the young people.

The aim of this session is to:

- give an introduction to the notion of demand avoidance provide some understanding of its root cause & link to anxiety
- inform of strategies to support the young person to engage
