Class Snippets - (Article 28- children have the right to an education. Article 29- Education should develop a child's talents, personalities and beliefs)

Pre-School - this week at Pre-School we started our Music Project with Rosie. We made some shakers and got involved in some music play with Rosie. We also completed some Christmas crafts for our families to order if they want to! We have enjoyed the Autumn sun, playing hide and seek in the garden and enjoying the school field. We had balloon play working as a team to keep the balloon up in the air which was good fun and caused lots of laughter! We have also enjoyed our first afternoon at Forest School today with Class 1. Our number this week has been 4 and our sound has been P.

Class 1 – in Class 1 this week we have been earning lots of marbles for our kindness jar. We have also been working hard on using our words to resolve conflicts and issues we may have with our friends. This is a really tricky concept, but the children have been wonderfully trying their best. In phonics, our new sounds this week are m, d, & g. Our HFW's are 'and, dad & am'. Please encourage your children to practise their sounds every time they read and remember, reaching the beehive is a really useful incentive to get your children to read at home. They start on the bee and finish on the beehive. In maths, we have been comparing quantities. We were making sure that we had enough items for the three bears to have a picnic and then moved on to comparing the different ways to make 4.

Class 2 – this week, we have started a new class book in English. We have begun to look at Lubna and Pebble. This is a story about a refugee child who only had a pebble as a friend. The children were all given a pebble at the start of the week to look after. We described our Pebbles using adjectives and described our homes using noun phrases. The children have all looked after their pebbles very well so far! In maths, the Y1s have begun to look at 2D shapes; they have also learnt the split digraph a-e in phonics. The Y2s have focused on the el, le and il spelling rules.

Class 3 have impressed me with their fabulous listening skills this week to produce amazing pieces of writing. They wrote stories based on Lights on Cotton Rock and reports about aliens. They have remembered all of the grammar taught so far. In music, they composed their own pieces using minums, crotchets and quavers. They enjoyed listening to Ode to Joy by Beethoven. A great week, well done!

Class 4 - this week, Class 4 have been very busy. In History, the children completed their flow maps about the Battle of Britain; we considered the tactics the Germans tried to use and how they were not successful, and the implications this had for Britain when the Blitz started. We also started to look at some resources from the Cheltenham Museum and what these items may be or used for - we will find out more on Monday afternoon! In English, we listened to Neville Chamberlain's speech, when he announced the start of WW2, and how this would have made people feel - the children did a really good job trying to create their own speeches with similar levels of formality, and they learnt how annotations can support the pace and tone of the delivery of speeches, too.
