Article 29- Education should develop a child's talents, personalities and beliefs) **Pre-School** are pleased to be back and seeing the start of the warmer weather! Thank you Mr and Mrs Dickinson for the work you have done in the garden. The children have enjoyed being outside having a spring clean and tidy ready for the sun! We have also had new toys donated by a parent in school and Benjamin brought in crown templates for us to decorate on Tuesday which the children enjoyed. We recalled our Easter holidays and what we got up to and if the Easter bunny came to visit! We have been creating Number-blocks with Lego, peg boards, puzzles, small world play and outdoor play on bikes and scoots and creating a skate board park with wooden planks.

Class 1 – exciting first week back. In English we have been reading Hairy Maclary from Donaldson's Dairy, doing lots of writing with adjectives, the pronoun 'I' and writing letters. We've started our foundation topics and have been looking at Castles in history and materials in Science. Phonics: we have started phase 4, this week we have been working on CVCC words such as went, band, mist.

Class 2 – what a wonderful week back with Class 2 this week! We started the week by planting some beans to investigate and observe them growing. On Tuesday, they were given the challenge of making predictions about our new book without seeing the title. They made some wonderful observations and inferences based on the front cover. We have also been using the conjunction 'because' to support our ideas and predictions. In maths, both year groups have started a position and direction topic. The Year 1s have focused on the vocabulary of left, right, above, below, in front of and behind. The Year 2s have been looking at anticlockwise, clockwise and right angle turns

Class 3 - have had a fantastic start to the summer term. They have been listening well, following instructions and working as a team. We have explored our new topic 'Local Industry' and created a display with watercolour pictures of different plants and animals found in the forest. In science, we looked at parts of a flowering plant and their functions. In writing, we have been recapping compound sentences and used these to write a diary in the role of Grandpa from our book Dear Earth. The children are very excited to continue reading 'An Alien in the Jam Factory' in Guided Reading to find out if Daffy Dodgy steals the jam inventions book! Keep up the great work, Class 3!

Class 4 have had a good first week back. In English, we have started to look at the darker origins of fairy tales and are focusing on Neil Gaimen's, Sleeper and the Spindle. The children seem really engaged with this text so far and are enjoying exploring the links to other fairy tales we have found. In Maths, both year groups have started new units – Y6 have been working on algebra and Y5 have started exploring fractions, decimals and percentages. In DT, the children were lucky enough to explore, and taste test, some Maya themed foods, including dark chocolate and cocoa powder – we spared them from the chilli test! To make you aware, C4's average attendance in school is the lowest class, therefore we are trialling an attendance initiative. This has been explained to the children so they should be able to tell you all about it. If there are any questions, please speak to Mrs Thomas directly. To be clear, this is for Class 4 only and is not currently school wide.

Skills for Learning, Learning for Life

Drug Awareness

Class 4 had two visitors from the Forest Street Wardens this week, the topic of this was drug awareness. This was an informative session about safety around legal (such as alcohol and smoking) and illegal drugs. The children were very engaged and asked lots of positive questions. The final activity was interactive where children could see mock examples in clear boxes of what was discussed; this helped children to understand in greater depth and gain awareness of objects that could be unsafe to pick up if seen.
