Children in Need – Friday 15th November

We will be celebrating Children in Need on Friday 15th November with a non-school uniform day and, if possible, by wearing something spotty! Pre-School – this week at Pre-School Halloween play has taken over! We have been hammering golf tees into different sized pumpkins, developing our fine motor skills, concentrating, and talking about size. At the end of the week, we carved the pumpkins scooping out the middle and adding faces which the children all did really well! We have made potions using different coloured water and sized tubs, pouring and filling. We have done lots of dancing, pumpkin printing with apples and created pictures of cauldrons. On Thursday, we had an exciting visit from the Fire Brigade and the children got to speak to the fire fighters, try on the coats and helmets, sit inside the fire engine and spray the hose pipes across the school field. We hope you have a lovely half-term break!

Class 1 – exciting week! The children met Harold the giraffe and did some learning about how to take care of ourselves, which tied in nicely with the learning we have been doing in class about staying healthy, by exercising, eating healthy and taking care of our teeth.

Thursday, we had some very special guests, which again tied in nicely with our previous learning of community heroes. The children were given a talk about the responsibilities of a Fire Fighter and were given some advice on how to keep ourselves safe at home. We then all got the opportunity to explore the fire engine and have a go with the fire hose. In phonics we learnt 'h,b' and HFW's are 'up, mum, put, ha, oh, hi, his, big, has'. Your children were sent home with a phase 2 sound mat and some words to help them practise blending. You may have also noticed the handwriting booklet to have a go at too, to support or children with their pencil grip.

Class 2 - what a busy week in Class 2! It has gone by very quickly! We finished our writing sequence based on Lubna and Pebble this week and the children were very excited to take their pebble home - with many of them making houses for their pebble. They have also finished a sequence based on the poem Ride-By Nights. On Wednesday, we were so excited to see Harold the Giraffe again and have a learning session based on feelings. The children also invited their parents in to do some autumn owl crafting with them. Thank you to all the parents who came to this and please keep an eye on your eSchools accounts as I will be sharing another date for next term soon! On Thursday morning, we were very lucky that the fire engine could come to visit us! The children had so much fun and were buzzing with excitement. They asked some very well-thought-out questions too!



Class 3 had an exciting week completing their cave art work. They made positive and negative relief handprints and then drew their charcoal animals onto their cave walls. They also painted pumpkin pictures in the afternoon as a class treat. In writing, they wrote excellent Haiku poems about magic and Autumn, which some children read in the Food Bank assembly. They have worked so hard this term and settled in very well to Y3/4. I hope they have a lovely half term.

Class 4 have enjoyed their last week of term! They have written their newspaper articles and the staff were really impressed with the results and the effort the children put in. In science, the children finished off their investigations linked to electricity and were all able to draw from their results to write clear conclusions. In DT, the children finished their Morse code boxes and were very proud of their results; after half term, they will start a music unit on Wednesday afternoons. PE will continue to be Yoga on Thursdays and Prostars on Fridays. To note, the children have not been set any grammar, maths or knowledge organiser homework and we hope they have a restful half term 😳
