

Pre-school – this week we have been enjoying the warm weather in the sun! The children have taken part in large scale painting, sand play and water play looking at capacity and experimenting with pouring and filling. We have also enjoyed ice cream and ice pops for afternoon snacks! The children going to Class 1 in September enjoyed their bump up mornings and Miss Byrnes was really pleased with them all. Sports Day was a hit! All of the children joined in in all of the races with big smiles on their faces! The parent's race was great too - thank you parents!! Our sound this week has been i and our number has been 6.

Class 1 – the children have had an exciting week, transitioning into their new classes, and meeting their new classmates. The children enjoyed a well-deserved tiptop after their efforts at sports day. In maths we have been looking at number bonds (besties) of 10, using a variety of resources to explore those number bonds. In phonics we have done lots of revisiting of HFW's and the new HFW's for this week are (their, our). In English, we have introduced our new book 'The Rainbow Fish' and have been focussing the book's vocabulary and we have been writing definitions of specific vocabulary.

Class 2 – what a busy week! Bump up days were a wonderful time; all the children were so welcoming and resilient! We have also continued our reading comprehension on the Magic Finger this week. The children used their inference skills to think about what the characters were feeling. The year 1s started a new maths topic of money and have been exploring 1p and 2p coins this week. Class 3 enjoyed welcoming the Y2 children this week for their bump up days. They created birthday cards for next year, affirmation balloons to decorate the classroom, got to know each other with bingo and played some games together. The children settled in really well on these mornings and enjoyed their time together. The children enjoyed taking part if Sports Day morning and all enjoyed a well-earned picnic lunch on the school field after. Well done Class 3!

Class 4 - this week has been a busy week! The current year 5's have enjoyed being year 6's for 2 mornings and welcoming the new year 5s! How is it that time of year already!? The Year 6's that were not on their secondary transition days this week have made us very proud helping out around the school and supporting other children with these changes. We have continued our DT topic where the children have been designing and making their own Mayan masks. We are at the stage where they are using their collage skills to bring their designs to life.
