### Olympic Games – key facts

The Olympic games began over 2,700 years ago in Olympia, Greece.

The Games were part of a religious festival, held in honour of Zeus, king of the gods and took place every four years at Olympia.

They included the following events - running, discus, javelin, long jump, wrestling, boxing, chariot racing and the pentathlon.

People from all over the Greek world came to watch and take part.

The Greek Olympics inspired the modern Olympic Games (which began in 1896).

### Myths

The Greeks had numerous gods and many stories and myths that surrounded them. Greek mythology consists of all the stories and tales about the Greek gods, goddesses, and heroes. Although the ancient Greek storytellers were quite inventive, and each told a myth in their own way, each god's personality and powers remained the same from story to story.

<b>3000 BC</b>	Greek civilisation begins.
<b>776 BC</b>	First Olympic Games are held
<b>508 BC</b>	Democracy is introduced in Athens.
<b>336 BC</b>	Alexander the Great becomes king.
<b>146 BC</b>	Invasion of Romans
<b>479 AD</b>	Athens and Sparta defeat the Persians.

**BC stands for Before Christ.**  
**AD stands for 'Anno Domini', which means 'the year of our Lord' in Latin.**

### Key Greek Gods and Goddesses

<b>Zeus</b>	God of the Sky and King of Olympus. (Brother to Hades and Poseidon)
<b>Hades</b>	God of the Underworld. (Brother to Zeus and Poseidon)
<b>Poseidon</b>	God of the Sea. (Brother to Zeus and Hades)
<b>Hera</b>	Goddess of marriage and Queen of Olympus.
<b>Aphrodite</b>	Goddess of love and beauty and protector of sailors
<b>Athena</b>	Goddess of wisdom and Athens was named after her. She liked Owls.
<b>Apollo</b>	God of light and music
<b>Hermes</b>	Messenger to the Gods
<b>Ares</b>	God of war.
